



RAY RYAN - MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Ray has worked with many prominent musical societies in varying capacities - chorus, principal roles, chorus master, and M.D., and played parts such as Mr. Snow (Carousel) and Mr. Bumble (Oliver) among many others. In addition to his interest in Musical Societies, he is a founder of The Firhouse Singers and Voice Squad (a close harmony barbershop group). He is also co-founder and M.D. of Marian College/St. Mary's School musical society, with whom he has just completed a very successful Oliver. Last year was his first visit to K.M.D.S. for Corousel.

MARIA QUIGLEY - CHOREOGRAPHER

Trained in Ballet and modern tap-dancing, as well as speech and drama from the early age of seven, Maria, while still at school played Jenie in Brigadoon with Loreto Musical Society. As a member of the Dublin Ballet School, she perfprmed with many socieities - Glasnevin, Take-Four, R&R etc. in shows including Gondoliers, Merry Widow, Showboat & Cabaret. In 1977 Maria turned her talents to choreography and worked on pantos, RTE shows, Tops of the Town and with many societies on shows such as Oklahoma, Fiddler on the Roof, Calamity Jane, Sweet Charity, Pirates of Penzance etc. with Baldoyle M.S. she received an A.I.M.S award for best choreographer for her work on Music Now.

JIM WILLIAMS - PRODUCER

Jim has directed and produced musicals and plays for our Society since it was founded over nine years ago. In addition he has worked with the E.S.B. Musical & Dramatic Society doing both plays and variety and with Dun Laoghaire Pieros, producing their pantos which have become a highlight of the entertainment scene in the borough in recent years. Among the plays Jim has produced have been O'Caseys "Plough and the Stars", Keanes "Big Maggie", B. Farrell's "Camaries", and Agatha Christies The Hollow, and Wilde's The Importance of Being Earnest. His musicals include Fiddle on the Roof, Pirates of Penzance, and last years winner Carousel. Jim has also worked with various youth groups and school productions.

SANDRA KELLY - MAGNOLIA

Sandra, appearing with Kilmacud Musical & Dramatic Society for the first time started her. singing career while in Notre Dame School, playing leading roles there in Oklahoma, The King and I, and the Wizard of Oz. In Blackrock College productions she sang principal roles in several Gilbert & Sullivan operettas, and with the R & R in Iolanthe. She was a soloist in two A.I.M.S. concerts in the National Concert Hall, and also with the Bunratty Castle Singers. At the Waterford International Light Opera Festival she played Sarah Brown with Arthur's Team production of Guy's and Doll's and is presently continuing her singing studies at the Dublin College of Music.

BRIAN McDONNELL - GAYLORD RAVENAL

Brian has worked with many societies both in Galway and Dublin - notably Renmore and Cameron. In the 1987 A.I.M.S. awards he was nominated best actor for his role as Oscar Jaffe in "On the 20th Century" with Renmore, and is a member of the award winning D.A.Y.M.S. production of Zorba the Greek. With Kilmacud Musical & Dramatic Society he comes to tread the boards for the first time in his former school - St. Benildus College.

EDDIE GUILMARTIN - CAP'N ANDY

In this his 50th year in show business our Society is very fortunate to have Eddie with us, playing one of his favourite roles - Cap'n Andy. Eddie who has taken part in more than 100 shows with 23 Societies throughout Ireland, joined us last year for Carousel. He has festival awards in Bangor and Waterford as well as several A.I.M.S awards to his credit.

Showboat, based on Edna Ferber's novel of the same name, has been hailed as the first modern American musical play - The story is colourful, with a believable plot and characters set against the romantic backdrop of the Mississippi River in the late 1880's and early 1900's.

Enriched by the talents of Jerome Kern and Oscar Hammerstein 2nd, its premier was in Washington in 1927, and during 1928/29 it ran for 350 performances in Londons Drury Lane.
