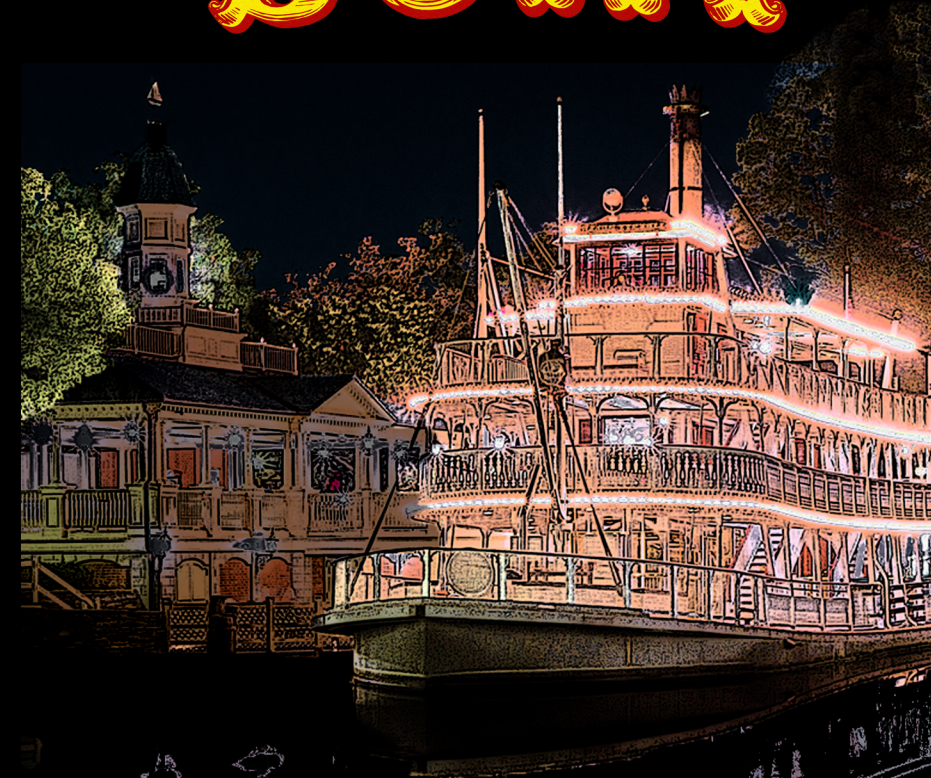

## ABOUT THE SHOW

Spanning the years from 1880 to 1927, "Show Boat" concerns the lives of three generations of show folk living on the showboat, the 'Cotton Blossom'.

The main plot follows Magnolia, the naive daughter of the ship's captain: Magnolia becomes the showboat's leading lady after her best friend, Julie is nearly arrested on charges of miscegenation (inter-racial marriage) when it's discovered that Julie's mother was black. Magnolia falls in love with the new leading man, the young gambler, Gaylord Ravanal. They marry and move to Chicago. Unfortunately, Gaylord's gambling habits soon lead them to ruin, forcing him to desert his wife and young daughter, Kim.

The passing of time reunites Magnolia and Kim with their family as well as with Gaylord, who eventually returns, offering a hopeful second chance at happiness.
